<p>Maths</p>	<p>Sing 2D shape song by clicking here.</p> <p>Go on a shape hunt around the house or your daily walk. What 2D shapes can you find in the objects that you see? (circle, square, rectangle, triangle ...) What do you notice about the shapes that you found? Which 2D shapes are most common?</p>	<p>Go on a 2D shape hunt around the house but today can you sort your shapes? How can you sort your shapes? What do you notice as you sort your shapes? What is the same/different?</p>	<p>Can you play a game with someone else in your house? You have one minute to hunt for as many circles, squares, rectangles, triangle etc... as you can. Swap places with your game mate. Can you keep a tally of how many shapes you each find?</p>	<p>Can you play a game with someone else in your house? This game is called 'Guess what I am?' You have a 2D shape hidden in a bag/ behind your back. You have to describe the hidden shape to your partner, using your shapes properties. You are not allowed to look at your shape, neither is your partner. Your partner has only 3 clues. Then swap places.</p> <p>What am I? I have 4 corners. I have 4 straight sides. All of my sides are the same length.</p>	<p>What can you draw using a range of 2D shapes? Can you draw a picture only using one shape? Can you have a drawing competition in your family? What was the winning picture? Why?</p>
<p>Reading Skills</p> <p>Reading a variety of books at home. Your child should, if possible, share a book every day. This can be reading a book aloud or sharing a book with an adult (story time).</p>	<p>Discuss a book with your child. Talk about the characters, events and setting.</p>	<p>Watch Newsround and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding?</p>	<p>Listen to the story of The Gruffalo here. Have a go at retelling the story in your home or back garden using your teddy bears.</p>	<p>Complete a book review on one of the books you have read - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone? You can use the template on our website or write straight into your book.</p>	<p>Read one of your favourite books to your teddy bears and have a teddy bear picnic.</p>

Practice reading the words.</p> <p>Look at the words said, so, have and like. Can you see what is tricky about them? Said – the 'ai' are making the 'e' sound. So – the 'o' is making an 'oa' sound. Have – you do not make the 'e' sound. Like – has a split digraph 'i-e'.</p> <p>Play quickwrite</p> <p>Challenge – can you write the sentences I like to play said the boy. So do you have some toys?</p>	<p>Write down all the different ways you can remember for writing the 'ee' sound. Did you find them all?</p> <p>Using the 'ee' sorting words challenge yourself to write 3 sentences.</p> <p>Remember the more 'ee' word you use the better!
