### **Drawing Club**

Drawing club takes children on a journey through the world of story and gives them the opportunity to explore their own imagination while developing literacy and creative skills. Drawing club operates on a three week rhythm - week 1: a story book, week 2: a traditional tale, week 3: an animation. Each week's stories are a springboard for joyful exploration through drawing and writing. The special symbols and passcodes that they write, when read out loud, can make magic — they can take characters or real life people to another world, they can make things happen (not always good!) and narrate the story the children wish to tell using the adult's earlier modelling as a launch pad. This term we will be adventuring around the following stories:







### **Phonics**

In phonics this term, the children will learn to read the first 20 Phase 2 sounds. Please follow the QR code which takes you to a parents page. Scroll down to Autumn Term 1 Phase 2 sounds for a video and downloadable pronunciation guide to the sounds we will be learning.

## **Understanding the world**



This term we will be helping the children to settle into Moulton Primary School, and together learn and understand the importance of our school rules and routines. The children will also learn how they are unique and special, the importance of friendship and how people in their family, school and local community are important and can help them. The children will then learn about the environments that they share with others, including their homes, school and places in the local community and how the natural environment changes during Autumn.
