<u>Parking at the Church – Message from the Church</u>

Can we kindly request that parents coming to drop off and collect children do not sit in the car park with their engines running. This is not great for pollution or for wasting of fuel. We are part of the Eco Church scheme and so we need to be aware of pollution and fuel wastage on our premises.

Finally, a drop down bollard has been fitted to a parking place that is adjacent to the gate that goes to our neighbours property. This will be lowered most of the time but if the neighbour wants access to the gate and need a vehicle close to the gate they will raise the bollard. We wanted to make you aware of this so you do not drive over the lowered bollard and damage their tyres or hit the raised bollard if it is up. We will be putting cones around the raised bollard to help with visibility of it.


Make a May Bower

- Adult supervision requiredtake care of sharp thorns and scissors, and be aware of poisonous plants and bird pool
- Make your bower on Friday after school or on Saturday morning, store it somewhere cool and spray it with water to keep it fresh.



You will need:

- . 2 wire coat hangers . Garden wire or string
- · Greenery and flowers (shop bought or from your garden)
- Scissors or secateurs
- Decorative ribbons (optional)
- · Tiny morris man (optional)



Bend the coathangers into circles and secure them with wire, string or tape as shown. Hang the bower from a chair or clothes airer etc to make it easier to work on...



Start winding greenery onto the frame, securing it with wire or string. Aim to cover the frame- Action Morris Man has added horizontal sections but you don't have to...



Next add flowers or blossom, and ribbons if you want to-Get creative! After the May Queen is crowned a morris dancer will hang your bower on the May cart. You can collect your bower after the carnival parade to re-use.
