The Classroom News


Year 1

After reading Stop! That's Not My Story! Year 1 have been writing their own narratives based on a range of Traditional Tales. They have thought carefully about the characters they might meet and the setting they might use. They have been making sure they have capital letters AND full stops. They have all done a beautiful job.

<u>Year 5</u>

In Year 5 this week we have started a new history topic all about the Ancient Greeks. So far, we have learnt about the location of Ancient Greece, the important events that happened during their civilisation, the gods and goddesses that they

worshipped and the most important city-states, Athens and Sparta. We have also learnt some new vocabulary such as polytheistic (worshipping multiple gods and goddesses) and some new locations, such as Mount Olympus and the Aegean Sea. The children worked particularly hard in our lessons about gods and goddesses and city-states, as they were set the challenge of researching these topics and producing fact files to showcase their research. The standard of presentation and the pride our Year 5 children took in these pieces of work was excellent and there are just a few examples included below.
