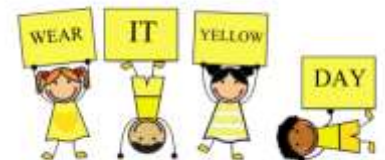

They bring the Emergency Department to patients who have suffered a life threatening or life changing trauma or medical emergency; providing advanced critical care to save lives.

The air ambulance service receives no funding from the government or National Lottery for their daily missions and they rely entirely on donations to raise the £2,300 they need for each rescue mission.
