
Maths

We will also be exploring how we sequence the days and months of the year.






English


We will start the term looking at how to tell a story using Stanley's Stick as inspiration. We use our imagination to write our own stories about our own sticks.


Science

We will learn about animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.




